Call for Papers: The Long 11th Century

The 43rd Interdisciplinary Viking Symposium wishes to shed light on the 11th century in Scandinavia – a century traditionally split in two nearly equal halves by the so-called “end of the Viking Age” – and address some of its main transformations and events going across the standard period threshold. Contributions may address various aspects of religious, cultural, social, political, and economic change – for instance, the introduction of Christianity, monetarization, urban developments, the reconfiguration of power structures, developments in literacy – as well as reflections on how this period, conceived as key in modern scholarship, was framed and remembered in the following centuries.

We invite paper proposals that engage with **the long 11th century** from scholars of at all levels and from all disciplines dealing with the Viking Age. Please send us a title and abstract of max. 300 words for consideration by **30th of April 2026**.
